All plants that are newly planted need to be thoroughly watered every day for 2 weeks, and then watched closely after that no matter what time of year it is. If you have an irrigation system that should not be a problem as you can just turn it on and relax. The weather should not dissuade you from landscaping in July or September as we have a great climate for plants.
